Assumption of Risk, Release, and Indemnity Agreement for Bean Life Science Museum Volunteers

This agreement is executed by _____, whose address is _____, to Brigham Young University, acting through its Monte L. Bean Life Science Museum ("BYU").

- 1.0 I desire to participate as a volunteer at the Monte L. Bean Life Science Museum with the _____ program (the "Program"), and I fully understand and appreciate the nature of the program, the dangers, hazards, and risks inherent in the Program described in the Museum Volunteer Policy and understand that serious or even fatal injuries and property damage could result from my participation in the program.
- 2.0 I represent that I have read and fully understand the General Volunteer Policy of Brigham Young University.
- 3.0 Knowing the dangers, hazards, and risks of the Program and the General Volunteer Policy of Brigham Young University, and in consideration of being permitted to participate in the Program, on behalf of myself, my family, heirs, and personal representative(s), I, the undersigned, agree and consent to assume and take upon myself all the risks and responsibilities surrounding my participation in the Program, including transportation, and in any independent activities undertaken by me relating to my participation in the Program, and in advance release, waive, forever discharge, and covenant not to sue BYU, its governing board, officers, agents, employees, and any students acting as employees, from and against any and all liability for any harm, injury, damage, claims, demands, actions, causes of actions, costs, and expenses of any nature that I may have or that may hereafter accrue to me, arising out of or related to any loss, damage, or injury, including but not limited to suffering and death, that may be sustained by me or by any property belonging to me, whether caused by negligence or carelessness of BYU, or otherwise, while in, on, upon, or in transit to or from the premises where the Program, or any adjunct to the Program, occurs or is being concluded.
- 4.0 It is my express intent that this Agreement shall bind the members of my family and spouse, if I am alive, and my estate, family, heirs, administrators, personal representatives, or assigns, if I am deceased, and shall be deemed as a "Release, Waiver, Discharge and Covenant" not to sue BYU. I further agree to save and hold harmless, indemnify, and defend BYU from any claim by me or my family, arising out of my participation in the Program.
- 5.0 In signing this Agreement, I acknowledge and represent that I have fully informed myself of the content of this Agreement by reading it before I sign it, and I understand that I sign this document as my own free act and deed; no oral representations, statements, or inducements, apart from the foregoing written statement, have been made. I understand that BYU does not require me to participate in the Program, but I want to do so, despite the possible dangers and risks. I further state that there are no health-related reasons or problems which preclude or restrict my participation in the Program, and that I have adequate health insurance necessary to provide for and pay any medical costs that may be attendant as a result of injury to me.
- 6.0 I agree that I have been furnished with a copy of all the rules established by the Bean Life Science Museum regarding safety and use of equipment as well as with a copy of the Bean Life Science Volunteer Policy. I represent that I have read and fully understand these rules and policy statement and agree to abide by them.
- 7.0 I further agree that this Release shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Utah. If any term or provision of this Agreement shall be held illegal, unenforceable, or in conflict with

any law governing this Agreement, the validity of the remaining portions shall not be affected thereby.

Brigham Young University Honor Code

Brigham Young University, Brigham Young University-Hawaii, Brigham Young University-Idaho, and LDS Business College exist to provide an education in an atmosphere consistent with the ideals and principles of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. That atmosphere is created and preserved through commitment to conduct that reflects those ideals and principles. Members of the faculty, administration, staff, and student body at BYU, BYU-H, BYU-I, and LDSBC are selected and retained from among individuals who voluntarily live the principles of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Observance of such is a specific condition of employment and admission. Those individuals who are not members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints are also expected to maintain the same standards of conduct, except church attendance. All who represent BYU, BYU-H, BYU-I, and LDSBC are to maintain the highest standards of honor, integrity, morality, and consideration of others in personal behavior. By accepting appointment on the faculty, continuing in employment, or continuing class enrollment, individuals evidence their commitment to observe the Honor Code standards approved by the Board of Trustees "at all times and . . . in all places." Dress and Grooming Standards

The dress and grooming of both men and women should always be modest, neat and clean, consistent with the dignity adherent to representing The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and any of its institutions of higher learning. Modesty and cleanliness are important values

that reflect personal dignity and integrity, through which students, staff, and faculty represent the principles and standards of the Church. Members of the BYU community commit themselves to observe these standards which reflect the direction given by the Board of Trustees and the Church publication, *For the Strength of Youth*. The Dress and Grooming Standards are as follows:

Men - A clean and well-cared-for appearance should be maintained. Clothing is inappropriate when it is sleeveless, revealing, or form fitting. Shorts must be knee length or longer. Hairstyles should be clean and neat, avoiding extreme styles or colors, and trimmed above the collar leaving the ear uncovered. Sideburns should not extend below the earlobe or on to the cheek. If worn, moustaches should be neatly trimmed and may not extend beyond or below the corners of the mouth. Men are expected to be clean shaven; beards are not acceptable. Earrings and other body piercing are not acceptable. Shoes should be worn in all public campus areas.

Women - A clean and well-cared-for appearance should be maintained. Clothing is inappropriate when it is sleeveless, strapless, backless, or revealing; has slits above the knee; or is form fitting. Dresses, skirts, and shorts must be knee length or longer. Hairstyles should be clean and neat, avoiding extremes in styles and colors. Excessive ear piercing (more than one per ear) and all other body piercing are not acceptable. Shoes should be worn in all public campus areas.

Conduct

All students shall be required to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the principles of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and the BYU Honor Code. Furthermore, all students are required to abstain from possessing, serving, or consuming alcoholic beverages, tobacco, tea, coffee, or harmful drugs. Involvement with gambling; pornographic, erotic, or indecent material; disorderly, obscene, or indecent conduct or expressions; or with other offensive materials, expressions, or conduct or disruption of the peace that, in the sole discretion and judgment of the university, is inconsistent with the principles of the Church and the BYU Honor Code is not permitted in student housing. All guests of students must comply with the Residential Living Standards while on the premises of university-approved housing. All students are required to know the Dress and Grooming Standards and abide by them. (The standards expressed above apply to students at all times whether on or off campus.)
